POKER HANDS RANKINGS


The highest possible hand, A-K-Q-J-10 of the same suit.
Good to know: Unbeatable hand. Bet and raise to maximize value, but consider slow-playing if the opponents play aggressively


Five consecutive cards of the same suit.
Good to know: Extremely strong hand. A similar strategy to the Royal Flush hand. Play aggressively, go for max value.

FOUR OF A KIND


Four cards of the same rank.
Good to know:: Very strong; bet aggressively. Rarely beatable hand.

## FULL HOUSE



Three of a kind and a pair.
Good to know: Strong hand. Bet for value, you will often face a stronger full house.


Any five cards of the same suit (in any order).
Good to know:: Strong but often beaten by higher flushes. Bet, but fold to heavy action if higher cards of the same suit are on the board.


Five consecutive cards of different suits.
Good to know:: Solid hand. Bet and call, but be cautious of higher straights and often flushes.

THREE OF A KIND


Three cards of the same rank.
Good to know: Good hand to trap your opponents, but watch out for full houses.

TWO PAIR


Two different pairs of cards.
Good to know: Decent hand. Bet moderately, but be ready to fold if faced with strong betting action. You will often lose against trips with this hand.

## ONE PAIR



Two cards of the same rank.
Good to know: A common hand. Play cautiously, especially in big pots or against multiple opponents
